# Breaking Open the Word

**BELIEF IN GOD'S PROMISES** 

The life of faith is one in which the believer

is inevitably called to deal with the tension

between God's promises and our present

experience. When the people of Israel were

dragged into exile their experience was that

their God was powerless to save and that

the ancient promises had been forgotten. It

is at precisely this moment that Isaiah dares

to proclaim a message of hope in the midst

of desolation, pardon instead of punishment,

and that the God who can subdue all things

will again stoop to gather the weak and lead

#### FIRST READING

Isa 40:1-5, 9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah. Prepare the way for the Lord.

'Console my people, console them' says your God.

'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem

and call to her

that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for.

that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for her crimes.'

A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord.

#### SECOND READING

THE SAVING WORD

2 Pet 3:8-14

A reading from the second letter of St Peter. We wait for new heavens and a new earth.

There is one thing, my friends, that you must never forget: that with the Lord, 'a day' can mean a thousand years, and a thousand years is like a day. The Lord is not being slow to carry out his promises, as anybody else might be called slow; but he is being patient with you all, wanting nobody to be lost and everybody to be brought to change his ways. The Day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then with a roar the sky will vanish, the elements will catch fire and fall apart, the earth and all that it contains will be burnt up.

Since everything is coming to an end like this, you should be living holy and saintly lives while you wait and long for the Day of God to come, when the sky will dissolve in flames and the elements melt in the heat. What we are waiting for is what he promised; the new heavens and new earth, the place where righteousness will
