A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

He cured many who suffered from diseases of one kind or another.

On leaving the synagogue, Jesus went with James and John straight to the house of Simon and Andrew. Now Simon's mother-in-law had gone to bed with fever, and they told him about her straightaway. He went to her, took her by the hand and helped her up. And the fever left her and she began to wait on them.

That evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were sick and those who were possessed by devils. The whole town came crowding round the door, and he cured many who were suffering from diseases of one kind or another; he also cast out many devils, but he would not allow them to speak, because they knew who he was.

In the morning, long before dawn, he got up and left the house, and went off to a lonely place and prayed there. Simon and his companions set out in search of him, and when they found him they said, 'Everybody is looking for you.' He answered, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighbouring country towns, so that I can preach there too, because that is why I came.' And he went all through Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and casting out devils.

Breaking Open the Word



THE SAVING WORD

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME / B

4 FEBRUARY 2024

CELEBRATING THE WORD OF GOD

Today the Church in Australia celebrates 'Word of God Sunday'. In establishing this day, Pope Francis invited us "to grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred scriptures" (*Aperuit Illis.* 30 Sep 2019). This celebration brings our attention to how we engage with the Word in the liturgy, and how we take the Word with us and proclaim it in our daily lives. Today let's focus on the Gospel.

Mark portrays Jesus discerning his ministry. We accompany Jesus on his journey: having left the synagogue, where he had been teaching and healing, he enters the house of Simon and Andrew, along with James and John, where he finds and heals Simon's mother-in-law. By evening as the sun is setting, the word is already out, and people are bringing the sick and possessed to him. Indeed, "the whole city was gathered at the door" (v. 33), and Jesus ministers to them. In the morning, while it is still dark, Jesus goes to pray. Simon leads a search, and when they find him, Jesus declares, "Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is why I came" (v. 38). What we see in this Gospel passage is the word and deed in action in Jesus, and his discernment through prayer to take his mission out further.

Nourished by the Word of God let us pray and discern our mission in our daily lives sharing the Good News beyond our doors.

I do not boast of preaching the gospel, since it is a duty which has been laid on me; I should be punished if I did not preach it! If I had chosen this work myself, I might have been paid for it, but as I have not, it is a responsibility which has been put into my hands. Do you know what my reward is? It is this: in my preaching, to be able to offer the Good News free, and not insist on the rights which the gospel gives me.

So though I am not a slave of any man I have made myself the slave of everyone so as to win as many as I could. For the weak I made myself weak. I made myself all things to all men in order to save some at any cost; and I still do this, for the sake of the gospel, to have a share in its blessing.

Greetings dear parishioners and visitors of our Twinned Catholic Parishes of St Andrew & St Agnes Malabar-Matraville.

Our 2024 Academic year has now commenced, and all systems a go! Welcome back everyone and hope that all our teachers, staff and students have had a very restful holiday. We look forward to welcoming the 2024 Kindergarten classes from St Andrew's and Sacred Heart Schools. Next Friday 9 February at our 9.00am Mass, we have

St Andrew's Catholic Primary School, Malabar Opening School Mass.

This Tuesday 7.00pm at St Andrew's Church, Malabar is our Parent/Carer Information evening for the Sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation, Confession) for those students in Year 3 (this includes all schools, State or Catholic in our parishes) and above who are already baptised. This meeting is essential to attend to be part of this Sacramental Program.

Please bring back your old palms from last Plalm Sunday. There are baskets at the entrances of our Churches, we need them to be returned to the church by next weekend.

In 1300AD Pope Boniface VII proclaimed the first Jubilee Year and since then the Church has adopted the practice of celebrating Jubilee or Holy Years as time of repentance, special blessings, prayer, and pilgrimage. The tradition in calling a holy year is generally every 25 years or other time when the Pope deems necessary as for the Jubilee Year of Mercy in 2015. The Jubilee Year 2025 begins with the opening of the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica, Rome 24 December 2024 and concludes when the Holy Door is sealed on the Feast of the Epiphany (6 January 2026). I have together with the Parish of Sydney City South and our Parishes of Malabar & Matraville to enter into a pilgrimage to visit holy spaces in Italy and Rome. This pilgrimage will be roughly 14 days and depart late April early May 2025. The pilgrimage will commence in Milan and working all the way to Rome, visiting such places as Milan(The Last Supper). Turin (Holy Shroud), Vencie (St Mark), Padua (St Anthony), Ravenna (capital of the Byzantine Empire), Sienna, Florence (David), Assisi Day Trip. The pilgrimage will combinate in Rome (7 nights) for the Jubilee celebrations. The costs are being sorted at present and I will get back to you ASAP. This I believe will be an experience not to be missed with many graces and blessing for each pilgrim. I would encourage as many to participate in this most wonderful experience. Pope Francis is calling all the world to Rome to celebrate as Pilgrims of Hope. Let us join him in prayer and journeying in faith. God Bless Fr John
